ECCO comprises soloists, chamber musicians, members of major American orchestras and string quartets, and GRAMMY Award winners, many with roots at the Marlboro Music Festival and conservatories. The orchestra's debuts in venues such as New York's Town Hall and the Kennedy Center confirmed its position as one of the most exceptional ensembles of today's generation. ECCO's fresh interpretations of new works along with beloved classics, coupled with passionate and joyous playing, earn it standing ovations and regular re-engagements for concerts and residencies.
